

Information on Final Exam

- Coverage** The final is comprehensive. It covers the whole quarter.
Study your lecture notes, the homework problems, and the relevant parts of the book. For additional practice problems, do problems similar to the assigned ones, either from the book or by changing the functions and numbers in the ones on the handouts. The class web site also has useful study aids.
- Supplies** Please bring your student ID, approved calculator, pencils, and erasers. We'll supply a test book, so you don't need a blue book or scantron.
- "Cheat Sheet"** You may bring one **double sided** sheet of notes, $8\frac{1}{2}'' \times 11''$. It must be written by hand by you in pen or pencil; it may not be produced by any other means (computer, photocopying, etc.). No other resources are permitted.
